

What applies for students in risk groups?

If your child is in a high-risk group for developing serious symptoms from the coronavirus, or if your child lives with a person who is at risk, you must present a doctor's certificate from a patient-assigned physician. The doctor's certificate must state that your child is in a high-risk group or lives with another person who is at risk. If you can present a doctor's certificate, your child's absence will be counted as an authorised absence.

If you are unable to present a doctor's certificate, your child's absence will be considered an unauthorised absence if he or she is kept home. This applies even if you, as the parent/guardian, report that your child or a relative is in a high-risk group. In order for the absence to be authorised, you must have a doctor's certificate that shows that the student is in a high-risk group or lives with a person who is at risk.

A student who is in a high-risk group and has a doctor's certificate, but who is otherwise healthy, should participate in regular lessons as much as possible. The school will help make arrangements for the student to participate in lessons.
